A snapshot of research activity

I have asked Ruth to email this message to all BSHG members with two bits of important news and a small request. There has been a major reorganisation of the NHS research funding. A new organisation, the National Institute of Health Research, now has a budget bigger than the Medical Research Council. It is focussed on translational research of clinical relevance. All NHS organisations are expected to support research and funding will follow this activity. I now chair the Genetics Committee of NIHR. Our job is to ensure we know what's happening and work to ensure effective recruitment to studies.

The Department of Health are concerned that our genetics research activity is not as high as it could and should be. They have provided funding for a research co-ordinator who will be based in Newcastle but available to help anyone in the UK who is planning a multi-centre study but is deterred by the bureaucracy. We will be looking to appoint someone in this important role in the next couple of months. The successful applicant will be a self sufficient, well organised person who is able to support clinical geneticists, genetic counsellors and laboratory geneticists who want to set up a new research study.
